PHASE 1

Phase 1 of this important project will be centered around Feasibility and Predesign. This phase will aim to confirm the various needs of the groups, explore building sites and their feasibility in terms of existing infrastructure, environment, future development, future needs, costs, etc. In November Leadership provided various locations for the ground testing to be done. We are still in the very early stages of the projects. Ground testing was needed to determine if the locations would sustain the infrastructure. While we wait for the results we are looking to move forward with the community engagement sessions.

These sessions will provide information on the ongoing work that Awas'ak Wiyasiwewin is doing towards the new Child Family Services infrastructure, and provide membership with the opportunity to share their perspectives on what they would like to see.




